

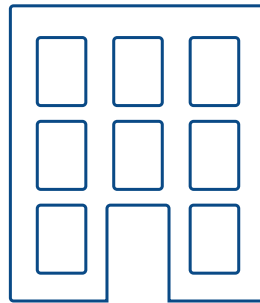

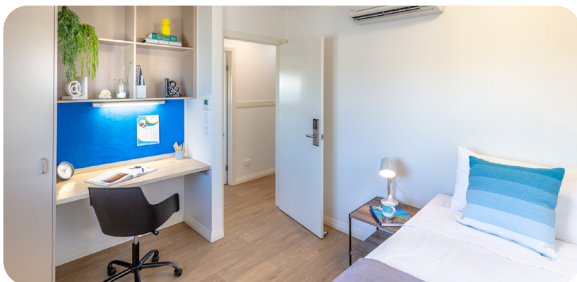

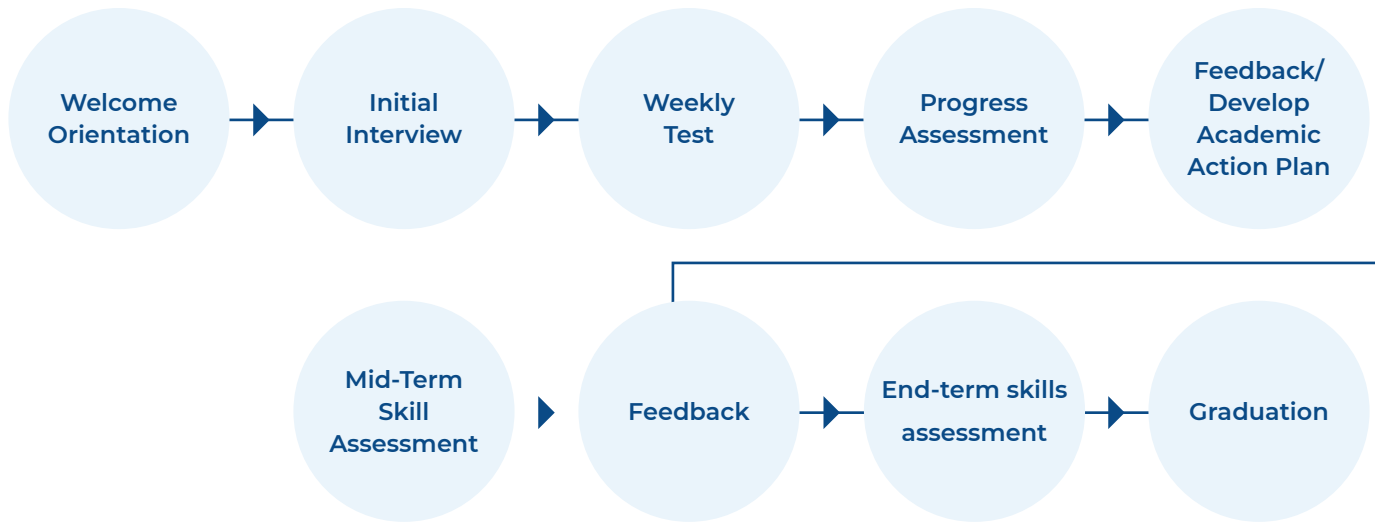

Progress Assessments

A weekly unit assessment is conducted to check understanding of grammar and topic vocabulary. Extensive skill testing is conducted at mid-term (week 5/6) and end-of-course (week 10/12).

This includes speaking, listening, pronunciation, reading, writing, and grammar skills.

Feedback

Following mid-term and end-of-course skill assessments, detailed feedback and counselling is conducted to help guide students in their performance and direction. Discussions are focused on student's progress regarding their learning objectives.

Personalised Learning Plan

Based on the mid-term and end-of-course-term (12 weeks) assessments and feedback, students create a personalised learning plan in consultation with their academic manager.

Academic Support

Further support is available from the academic management staff on guidance and monitoring of goal setting, learning habits and research skills.

Our Methodology

CCEB's methodology focuses on immersive, communicative, and student-centred learning approaches. This methodology prioritizes real-life language use, enabling students to practice English in practical contexts, rather than solely relying on traditional grammar and vocabulary drills. Teachers often employ task-based learning, where students engage in activities like role-plays, group discussions, and problem-solving exercises to reinforce their speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills.

In addition, there is a strong emphasis on scaffolding, where teachers provide structured support. The goal is to create a supportive environment where learners feel confident to experiment with the language and develop their skills organically, encouraging active participation and fostering a deeper understanding of English in everyday settings.

Our Assessment

Our use of formative and summative testing at CCEB helps teachers monitor student progress and adjust instruction accordingly. The main purpose of our assessments are to identify learning gaps, provide timely feedback, adapt our teaching strategies and encourage students to self-reflect and set goals.

Types of testing used are quizzes/mini tests, self-assessment, peer reviews, oral assessments, essay writing and interactive tools such as Kahoot, Quizlet and textbook Presentation Tools.

English for Academic Purposes (EAP) Course

Course Duration

10 Weeks

Course Overview

The English for Academic Purposes (EAP) program is designed to prepare students for successful study at universities, colleges, and vocational institutions. The course develops the language, academic skills, and study strategies necessary to participate confidently in academic settings.

Students will learn how to read and analyse academic texts, write structured and coherent assignments, deliver effective presentations, and engage in academic discussions. The program also builds critical thinking and research skills, ensuring students can meet the demands of higher education.

Course Objectives

By the end of the EAP course, students will be able to:

- Comprehend academic texts and identify key arguments, evidence, and structure.
- Write essays, reports, and research projects using appropriate academic style and referencing.
- Deliver clear, engaging oral presentations and participate in academic seminars.
- Take effective notes from lectures and readings.
- Develop critical thinking skills and apply them to problem-solving and analysis.
- Use academic vocabulary and grammar accurately and fluently.

Key Skills Covered

- ✓ **Reading:** Skimming, scanning, detailed reading, identifying bias, and critical analysis.
- ✓ **Writing:** Academic essay structure, cohesion and coherence, paraphrasing, summarising, citing sources, and avoiding plagiarism.
- ✓ **Listening:** Understanding lectures, identifying main ideas, and taking accurate notes.
- ✓ **Speaking:** Participating in discussions, debating, and delivering academic presentations.
- ✓ **Research Skills:** Using libraries, online databases, and evaluating sources for credibility.

Entry Requirements and Course Structure

Levels: Upper-Intermediate to Advanced (entry via placement test or IELTS equivalent).

Assessment: Continuous assessment including essays, presentations, and in-class tasks; final integrated skills assessment.

Pathways

Successful completion of the EAP course can provide direct entry into partner higher education facilities (we are the preferred entry provider for James Cook University), without the need for an external English test (such as IELTS).

Who Should Enrol

- International students at B2 level who require C1 levels of English for university entry
- Professionals preparing for postgraduate or research study in English.
- Students who have met the general English requirements but need targeted academic skills.

High School Preparation (HSP)

Course Information

Course Overview

The High School Preparation (HSP) program is designed for international students who plan to enter an Australian high school. It equips students with the English language proficiency, academic skills, and cultural understanding necessary to succeed in a mainstream secondary school environment.

Students study a combination of English for Academic Purposes, subject-specific vocabulary, and essential study skills. The course also focuses on building confidence, independence, and the ability to adapt to Australian school life.

Course Objectives

By the end of the course, students will:

- Achieve the required English language level for high school entry.
- Develop academic literacy for key high school subjects (Mathematics, Science, Humanities, Technology, Arts).
- Understand and apply Australian school rules, expectations, and study practices.
- Build skills in notetaking, summarising, oral presentations, and essay writing.
- Participate actively in group work, discussions, and project-based learning.
- Gain awareness of Australian culture, history, and daily life.

Course Structure

Levels: Elementary to Upper-Intermediate (entry based on placement test).

Duration: 20–48 weeks depending on entry level and target high school requirements.

Hours: 25 hours per week (20 hours face-to-face, 5 hours supervised self-study or projects).

Intake Dates: Weekly or term-based entry (flexible according to student needs).

Entry Requirements

- Age: 12–17 years old
- Placement test to determine English level and course duration
- Valid student visa (or other suitable visa)

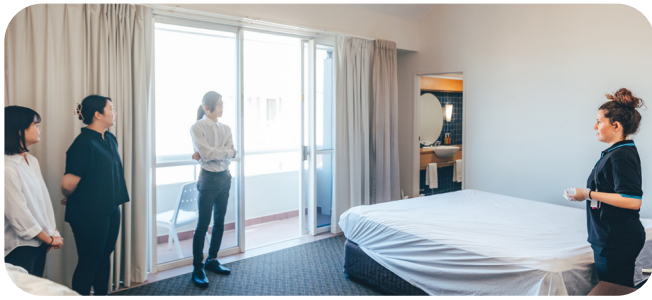
